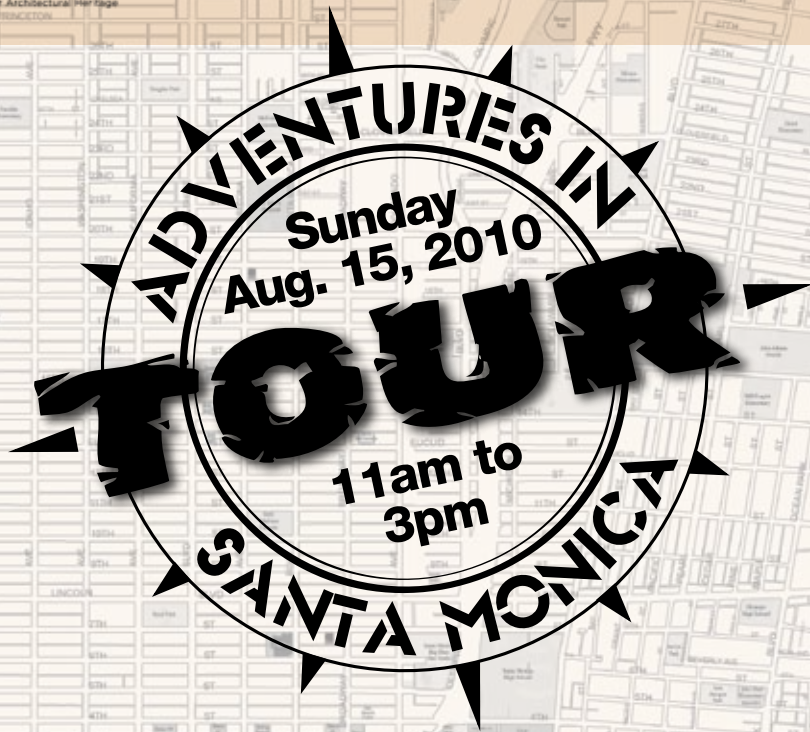




The Santa Monica Conservancy presents...

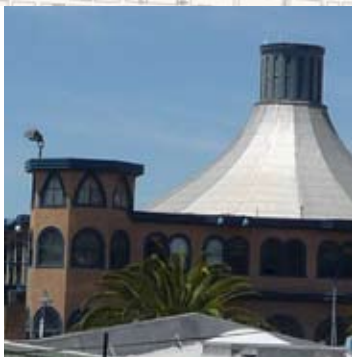


How much fun can you handle in one afternoon?

Bring the kids, bring the whole family! This tour is unlike any the Conservancy has hosted before, taking you to corners of town you never had time to visit, or that weren't open to the public, or you never knew existed! Check-in at the Santa Monica Civic Auditorium. From there you can explore at your leisure, in your car or on your bicycle, the destinations that interest you most. **Tour directions will be provided at check-in.** Docents will be at every location with more information to enrich your visit. But remember, it all wraps up at 3p.m.



◀ **Start back stage at the SM Civic Auditorium.**
See the dressing rooms, ride the orchestra pit into the basement and watch the unique hydraulic floor convert from an inclined performance configuration to a flat exhibit space. This Welton Becket landmark has hosted the Oscars, trade shows and most of the legends of rock 'n roll.



◀ **Apartments above the Carousel**
Not usually open to the public, these apartments, now offices, were once the homes and offices of musicians, artists and activists who enjoyed the magnificent views and the calliope music. **Includes a free ride!**



▲ **Angel's Attic**
Enter the world of antique and contemporary dollhouses along with miniatures, dolls and toys in a charming Victorian house. **Admission fee included.**

▶ **Inkwell Beach**
There was a time when racial tension at local beaches forced the black community to congregate unbothered at Inkwell Beach. It was the only part of Santa Monica Beach open to African-Americans, and it was here that many young black surfers got their start.



▶ **Artist Studios**
Some of Santa Monica's most talented artists are going to open their studios, located in a converted historic airport hangar at the Santa Monica Airport, just for us to get an up-close look at their recent work.



▲ **The Z6 House**
Tour this fabulous pre-fab home made of wood, glass, and steel – a model of a line of green, modular, single-family houses offered by a company called LivingHomes which are built to minimize their ecological footprint. After the site preparation, assembly took just 13 hours.



▶ **Gabrielino/Tongva Springs**
On August 4, 1769, Father Crespi said these springs reminded him of the "tears of Saint Monica." Today, the springs still flow. Our host is a descendant of the tribes who lived here for 1000 years and you will hear about these ancestral lands and the forces that threaten their future.

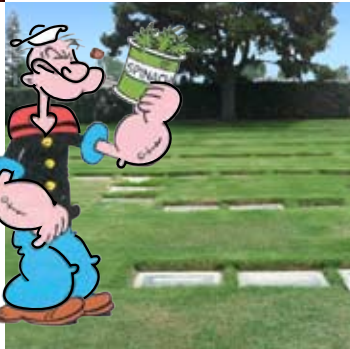


▶ **Ferris Wheel**
Ride Santa Monica's solar-powered Ferris wheel. Discover the mechanics of the state-of-the-art light display and how the previous wheel was sold on eBay. **Includes a free ride!**

▶ **California Wash Mural**
Walk the serpentine garden with its landscape sculpture mimicking the path that waters took to reach the sea before the city's development replaced the natural washes with storm drains.



▶ **Meet Popeye at Woodlawn Cemetery**
Elzie Crisler Segar, the cartoonist who created Popeye, is buried in Santa Monica and you will meet a Popeye impersonator who will tell you about the cartoonist's short but remarkable life.
